Suncoast Gem & Mineral Society, Inc. Board of Directors Meeting March 07, 2019

Meeting was called to order by President Joe Cooper at 7:03 p.m.

Board members in attendance were Joe Cooper, Susan Biel, Eric Odegaard, Pat Davis, Dave Watson, and Dan Stefanski.

Secretary's report- Motion by Dan Stefanski to approve the minutes as printed, and the motion was approved.

Treasurer's report- Eric Odegaard presented the treasurer's report, after discussion, Eric will amend his report to better reflect a refund to a vendor at our show. With that modification, Susan Biel made a motion to accept the report and file for audit. The motion was approved.

Eric also reported to the Board that there are still some problems with the use of envelopes for the shops. His concern is that the money in the envelope doesn't equal the amount reported on the envelope and on the shop sign-in report. Moderators are asked to double check their figures. Further, to make things easier Eric will keep \$25.00 in the shop bags for change. If a moderator makes change, just put the members large bill in the shop bag, take that amount out as change, then give the correct change to the member and put the shop time amount in the envelope. Sign and date the envelope, including the dollar amount for shop time, the amount for material and/or cutting fee, and the total amount in the envelope. (Example: a member works 3 hours = \$9.00 he only has a \$10.00 – take a \$5 bill and 5 one dollar bills from the shop bag, leave the \$10 in the bag then give the member back a dollar then put \$9 in the envelope). There should be \$25 in the shop bag at all times, and the amount on the sign in sheet and the envelope should equal the cash in the shop bag.

Susan asked if an order to the exterminator for rodent control had been issued. Eric will check his records, and follow up on the matter.

In other financial business, Susan Biel requested \$40 to purchase ice cream and topping for the Club Ice Cream Social. Her request was approved.

Old Business- Joe Cooper reported that the new blade is on order. He is concerned with the use of the saw and the Board will develop a training and certification program for all monitors before the saw is used. Further we plan to install a new outside door in the Cab Room this Month.

New Business- Our guests Richard Bunton and Bonnie Boyson were introduced. Pat Davis announced that Richard has agreed to run for a Board seat. The Board congratulated him on his decision and said he will be a great addition to the Board. As the nominating committee chair, Pat further informed the Board that the 2019 slate of officers are; Cooper (president), Biel (vice- president), Davis (past president), Odegaard (treasurer), Groves (recording secretary), Stefanski (Corresponding Secretary), Watson (board member), and Richard Bunton (board member).

Cooper stated that we have purchased three new jewelry benches and that work to find more space for the silver class will start soon.

Cooper continued the new business by stating that we are seeking volunteers to train as backups for key positions, like Web Page maintenance, Rock A Gram newsletter, committee Chairs, subcommittees, and training and certification for back-up shop moderators. Biel asked Stefanski to send emails out to members so we will know who is interested. Stefanski will comply.

Biel discussed the layout of the Griffin Room during the show. The Board agreed that to provide more room we will eliminate demonstrations at future shows. The Board also discussed trailers and sheds needed for storage. Stefanski motioned that if we can find a trailer for around \$800 and a shed for a thousand dollars Cooper is authorized to make such a purchase. Motion carried. The Board further discussed reducing the volume of rock for sale at the club table, to accomplish this we will seek club volunteers to help sort all of our material. That way we will have a good selection for the show but reduced volume to cart around.

Local field trips were discussed. Stefanski will check with Joe Pierce to see if he would help us secure some local sites for field trips.

Show report- Bill Schmidt reported the show numbers were up 35 people from last year, and that all venders appeared to be pleased with the show. A few venders would like to close at 5 P.M. No decision has been made. Friday and Sunday we're our slow days with Saturday being very busy.

With no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
