#### FUN FACTS

### Did you know:

The MOHS Scale was developed in 1822 by Friedrich Mohs when he selected 10 gem stones and set their HARDNESS factors from 1—10.

The hardness is determined by how easily the stone is SCRATCHED - NOT its durability in regards to IMPACT where it might crack, chip or break.



The scale is not proportional! The hardness of DIAMONDS at 10 is many times harder than CONRUNDUM (rubies and sapphires) which is the next gem on the scale.

The hardness scale is used to determine the suitability of a gem for use in jewelry.

### BISMUTH—

— an odd looking mineral associated with some odd names! The name "bisemutum" first appeared in the 1400's in the writings of Swiss scientist, Theophratus Bombastus Von Hohenheim (he went by the shortened Latin name of "Paracelsus") but credit has been given to French Scientist, Claude Geoffrey The Younger who in 1753 maintained that the name originated from the German words "Weisse Masse" meaning white mass. While minute bits of bismuth occurs in most stones, it is mined in the area of Schneeberg, in the Erzgebirgskreis district of Saxony, Germany!

IN ORDER TO BID ON AN ITEM: Starting with the Opening Bid amount, or higher, click on **COMMENT** right under the photo and type in your bid. (Please try to keep your bids on the FIRST photo in a group. Do not REPLY to previous comments. Please do not type anything other than bids in the comments). Bids are to be no less than \$1.00 increments.

THE LAST COMMENT ON AN ITEM WILL BE THE FINAL BID (as long as it is the highest bid; should the last bidder enter a bid lower than the previous bidder, the win will go to the highest bidder; if the last bid is the same as the second to last bid, the win goes to the second to last bidder who stated that price first).

THE WINNING BIDDER WILL BE CONTACTED THROUGH THE FACEBOOK MESSENGER APP, so please be sure to have it set up to receive a message about your winning(s) and to supply your contact information for the charge of the sale.

YOU MUST RESPOND WITH YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION BY 8:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY APRIL 18TH OR THE WIN GOES TO THE PREVIOUS BIDDER.

- If you wish to pay by CREDIT CARD— you will be emailed an invoice from the SGAM STRIPE account (STRIPE is just another version of Paypal or Venmo). Accepted cards: VISA, Mastercard, Discover and AMEX. DO NOT use the GOOGLEPAY option, it is not set up.
- If you are not local, your items will be combined and the postage calculated; a shipping invoice will be emailed to you and upon payment, the items will be mailed to you.
- If you are local, you will be contacted about a DATE and TIME for pickup at the Clubhouse.
- The local pick up will only be CASH or CHECK—(and those who paid previously through STRIPE); there will <u>not</u> be a facility to pay with a credit card, so please plan ahead.

Rick Bunton will accept nomination to retain his position as Vice President, as will Patricia Church for Treasurer, and Susan Biel for Corresponding Secretary.


After many years serving as Recording Secretary Gerri Groves is stepping down. We owe her many, many thanks for her dedication to this task since 2014.

## Gem of The Month: Diamond

While the diamond is the traditional birthstone of April, in recent years the practices used in mining have come into light as being unethical, exploitative, dangerous and the



cause of crime, violence and even civil war, garnering it the nickname of the "blood" or "conflict" stone.

Fortunately, there are other stones that have been associated with the month of April over the centuries: sapphire, opal, white topaz and quartz; some of these associations pre-date the recognition of the diamond birthstone; sap-

phire was recognized as the April gemstone in Roman, Hebrew, Slavic and Arabic calendars; opal was noted in the Tibetan calendar.

Quartz has only recently been included as an alternative to diamond, mainly due to its similarity in appearance. One of special note is the Herkimer Diamond, a quartz that was named "diamond" because of its double terminated crystals.

Although it is admirable to pursue a more ethically sourced gemstone, the intense marketing of the Diamond has allowed it to maintain it prominence for both the birthstone

and engagement rings. Whilst they are a stunning gemstone unto themselves, I cannot picture a Herkimer diamond ever supplanting the true diamond!
