RANDOM ROCK FACTS!

- Bismuth has a higher atomic number than uranium but is nonradioactive, which makes it a unique element in the periodic table. It also has one of the lowest levels of thermal conductivity among metals.
- Olivine, a mineral commonly found in meteorites, can also be found on beaches in Hawaii in the form of green sand due to volcanic activity. It is one of the first crystals formed as magma cools.
- Azurite was historically important for producing a pigment known as as "blue verditer". Interestingly, azurite undergoes a chemical change and morphs into malachite over time when exposed to carbon dioxide and moisture.
- Galena crystals can be used as semiconductors and, due to their ability to detect radio signals, were used to make the earliest crystal radios in the 1900s.





- Ulexite is known as "TV Rock" because of its natural fiber optic properties. It transmits light along its fibers and a clear image of anything placed beneath it can be seen on the surface as if the object were on a TV screen.
- Barite is a mineral consisting of barium sulfate and is primarily used to make highdensity concrete for blocking X-ray emissions in hospitals, power plants, and laboratories. It also serves as a weighting agent in drilling fluids in the oil and gas industry.
- Sphalerite is the chief ore of zinc and contains significant amounts of cadmium sulfide. It has a unique property called triboluminescence, which means it sparks when struck. This feature is due to the electrical charges released when crystals are fractured.

Summerville Lace Agate Trip

In Summerville, Georgia, on Route 27, is located the Patty Quarry—Home of the Summerville Lace Agate.

It is an active quarry Monday through Saturday, but on Sunday the quarry is open to the public. All that is asked of the public is that they sign a waiver located in the mailbox behind the office and not to disturb the machinery.

And now for the good parts: There aren't any fees for collecting. You can drive your vehicle right up to the area where you would like to collect. Most of the digging has been done for you.



There are piles of clay-caked rocks ready to be investigated. Some people prefer to dig into a wall to try to find a pocket of lace agate. Most people appeared to collect from the rock piles. Off to the left there are mounds of small stones suitable for tumbling. This is how the quarry appeared February of this year.



Mrs. Patty visited the quarry and shared this tip: look for where the trucks have driven. Pieces fall off and get pushed into the road.

It would be good to have some sort of pry tool to get those pieces sunk into the road. Unless you were interested in digging into a wall in hopes of finding an agate vein, no tools are necessary except maybe the pry tool.

Wax casting is a \$50.00 class which includes one 3 inch flask, in two sessions, which involve investing spruced trees in preparation for the burnout process and then melting and pouring into the remaining cavity to produce the cast pieces. Finishing of the cast pieces is minimal and participants are encouraged to attend the silversmithing lab if they would like help in this last stage.

Be aware of these 4 common scams

"I thought it was someone from the bank!"

Scammers are professional imposters. They'll pretend to be a relative, a utility company or even Bank of America.

"They said I had an overdue bill."

Scammers want to make you panic and overreact without thinking. A loved one in trouble, a late bill or an amazing deal are all tactics to throw you off.

"She needed my account info right away."

Scammers will want your money fast. They'll tell you to send funds immediately, often via wire transfer or payment apps, where the money is unlikely to be recovered.

"He was so friendly."


Scammers often use social media to deceive. They'll try to befriend you, strike up a relationship, then hit you with exclusive "insider" deals and get-rich-quick schemes. Please be aware of these scammers.

Do not send them gift cards or money.
