For the Love of Rocks-Part II

In a previous article in this newsletter, I mentioned my "refusing" to buy a rock, and carrying very large stones with me from Central NY to Florida.

Well, I have actually purchased quite a few slabs from the Club so that I had material to work with - and there is a great selection of some gorgeous stone to work from. I think our annual show is also a perfect opportunity to pick up slabs for cabbing.

This summer my ten-year-old Grandson, who has had the Rockhound Gene passed on to him, came to visit from Seattle, WA, and he brought with him beach pebbles from Puget Sound. He brought them knowing that I was going to teach him how to cab. We had lots of fun revealing the potential of these pebbles.

With this source in mind, I gathered similar rocks from the shore of Lake Ontario when I went to visit Syracuse later in the summer, and then on my trip this Fall to California and Seattle, guess what I made a beeline for? I even stuffed a USPS "if it fits it ships" small box with stones from the California beaches and mailed them home before I left the West Coast. The one beach in Northern California I was able to get right down on to, had a sign stating that it was "One of The Most Deadly Beaches in California" because of the Tsunami risk! It sure put a dash in my step to get out and gather my pebbles!

Some very plain rocks turned into lovely cabs, some plain rocks stayed, well, plain rocks! Some rocks that looked like they had great potential didn't hold up or even lost some of their "superficial beauty" in the grinding process. From what I have researched online, they are mostly granites, variations of Rain Forest Jasper, and other jaspers, serpentine, a bit of agate, and of course, lots of The Great Unknowns. What really intrigues me is that there are rocks from both Lake Ontario and Puget Sound with flashes of what appears to be silver? (or, hmmm, maybe just mica?) but, to me it feels like I discovered some amazing treasure! You never know what beauty may lie in a humble stone!
