

QuartZ

Quartz is one of the most common minerals in the earth. Quartz crystallizes in the hexagonal crystal system. "Hex" means six. Find a quartz crystal and count the number of flat faces around the crystal. You will find there are six! On this picture you can see three faces. On the other side of the crystal that you cannot see, there are three more faces.

On the mineral scale of hardness (which is also called "Moh's Hardness Scale" because it was invented in 1822 by a German scientist named Friedrich Moh) quartz is number 7.

Uses: Quartz is used to make glass. It is also used in jewelry, especially when it is colorful. It is also used in watches and other electronic equipment.

Colors: Quartz is found in many colors. Purple is called Amethyst Pink is called Rose Quartz White is called Milky Quartz Brown is called Smoky Quart Black is called Morion Yellow is called Citrine



HINTS & TIPS

How to find the Fire in fire Agate: Fire agate is a quartzbased rock with layers of iron oxide in chalcedony which results in iridescence. It occurs in nodules of milky or grayish translucent chalcedony. Sometimes it is found in botryoidal growths in geodes and in chalcedony roses. Fire agate appears as a dull, reddish brown layer, but when the surface layers are removed the rainbow colors or iridescence are exposed. The fire is brought out by tumbling, trimming, and grinding off the outer layers to expose the iridescence. Polishing magnifies the fire.

To find the fire, remove the matrix, then tumble polish the stones. Tumbling removes the excess chalcedony. When polished, remove excess stone around the edges, then polish and set. Allow the stone to retain its irregular shape and polish slowly, so you don't go through the fire layers. The graceful natural shapes are superior to those cut to calibrated sizes, as the best fire doesn't always fit a mold. To set it off, mount the fire agate in a custom-made gold or silver setting. Fire agates are most often found in Arizona, California, Idaho, and Mexico, among other locales.

Meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m., by President Dave Cordes.


After the Pledge, Sue Hazeldon gave the September's treasurer's report and Bill Schmidt gave us an update on our upcoming show.

Minutes of Board Meeting November 6 2007

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m., by Vice President Bill Schmidt. Also present were Sue Hazelden, Sue Black, Homer Rankhorn, Evie Loster, Julia Larson, Dave Cordes; and newsletter editor: Debbie Bremer.

Minutes from last meeting were accepted as published. The 2006-07 audit was also accepted.

The treasurer's report was accepted, with a suggestion that next month's report include a breakdown of the amounts paid to the contractor and a note as to what these payments covered. Sue Hazelden supplied a verbal list. She also stated that property taxes had gone down a bit. They are due in December. There is a concern that the club will be left with very little cash on hand when the construction costs were paid. The yard sale did not generate as much money as the one in April did. The board agreed to store the unsold items at the clubhouse, with the thought of having a yard sale there early next year. Sue said, she is unable to hold future sales at her house. There was insufficient help for her to set up the day before the sale, and she had to do much of the physical work herself. One member made a cash donation to the yard sale proceeds.

Old Business:

Construction at the clubhouse is well underway, but probably will not be completed until January. Discussion was held regarding opening classes to the general public. Julia will verify this with the insurance liaison at the meeting in Biloxi, but the general feeling is that only club members would be covered by insurance, so opening the classes to the public probably should not be permitted. Gert and Tom McWilliams sent Sue a congratulatory email regarding the construction.

The issue of turf blocks vs. gravel for the driveway was discussed. This would involve another trip to the county, which Dave said, he would handle. Also under discussion was the issue of a planted hedge vs a three-foot fence. One club member has several ixora plants she wants to donate, and Julia will go by to see these.

Painting, refinishing a small floor section and bathroom tile will have to be done by club members. <u>WE NEED VOLUNTEERS FOR THIS</u>. It was brought out that those who volunteer often do not show up when scheduled. We need to be able to count on volunteers from the general club membership, not just on the handful of folks who always seem to end up doing 98% of the work.

Show Reports:

Currently we have only seven dealers. Several have dropped out this year, and several have not responded. Sue is trying to get Channels 9 and 10 to carry show information on air. Show flyers and cards were done by Debbie Bremer and given to Bill Schmidt for printing. Since some of the bigger dealers will not be coming, we not have to order as many flyers. Wilda Bisset will continue to address the show cards as she has done in the past.

Nominating Committee: A nominating committee for next year's board members has to be appointed this month. This will be addressed at the general meeting. Nominees' names have to be in the January 2008 newsletter.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
