Cab Room Etiquette

Our club facilities are intended to provide the opportunity and means to learn and enjoy our hobbies. To that end, we would like to address a number of topics and issues that affect anyone using our cab room.

Respect

You need to respect yourself, others, the equipment, and the building.

As a member of the club, you are privileged to work in the shop and practice your hobby, without having to purchase your own equipment. It is your responsibility however, to use the equipment properly, and assist with the cleaning and maintenance. This responsibility includes reporting any issues that arise with the equipment. It also includes cleaning up after yourself, even if you are leaving a session early.

Respect your surroundings, the sink area, the walk ways, safety first.

Machines are intended for all, so if more than one wants to use the same machine, you'll need to share the time and take turns – communication between fellow members is key.

Be conscious of your work area, and that you're not encroaching on someone else's workspace. For example, if you're bringing in many items to work on, you might limit the items in your work area. There is a shelving unit to place any other items you are bringing in.

The use of the equipment is intended for our members' training and hobby use, not for production. The machines are not intended for or built for mass production. The machines will not last if they are subject to hard core commercial use.

Safety

Protect yourself: You should wear proper fitting clothes, no loose sleeves. Long hair should be tied back, or otherwise restrained. Closed-toe shoes only. You may bring safety glasses or there are some available in the shop.

Be aware of your water usage, as on some machines the valves allow water to flow too freely, if you walk away the water can spray to the floor. The valves if opened too far can cause the basin or tray to overfill.

If you see a puddle of water or any other liquid substance on the floor - don't walk in it, run up to it, or through it - wipe it up!

The purpose of using water while cutting or grinding stone, is to alleviate dust and debris in the air. Breathing dust is not healthy. The only machine intended to be used without water is the buffer/polisher. The buffer/polisher machine is only intended for limited period use to produce a final finish. Prolonged use of this machine will release particulate matters. If your piece does not produce a high polish quickly, it's not ready for a final buffing, go back to a previous step. If you're buffing for an extended period of time, you're releasing dust into the air that everyone is forced to breathe. That must not happen.

Machines and Equipment

If you use a machine, you'll be plugging in the equipment and turning on water. When you're done, you'll need to turn off the water and the machine. If you are leaving for the day, and no-one else is waiting to use the machine, clean-up after yourself, and unplug the machine. If you and someone else are both using a machine during shop time, either or both of you may assist with cleaning the equipment and area. Note: by default the obligation to clean-up is held by the last one using a machine. Always turn-off the machine and water source if you step away from a machine.

Learn how to use the machines properly. Ask questions if needed. Example with the cab wheels, use the entire wheel, not just the center. [Using only the center wears out the wheel prematurely, which will require replacing too soon.]

The cab room hours are posted, and you may arrive when we are open. The shop closes promptly at respective time of day or night the shop is scheduled. That means, 10 minutes prior to the closing, stop working, and start cleaning and unplugging. All participants are to be done, cleaned-up and walking out the door at the end of the shop time. If you leave early, and no one else is using the machine, you'll need to clean the machine...

Fees – We accept Cash and Checks.

Plan ahead, and try and bring the proper amount to pay for the time you intend to be in the shop. While we may have some change available, we are not a bank and don't have unlimited change.

If you don't have the means to pay the proper amount, don't get started. There are no 'I Owe You's.

So the next one is October 26th at 7:00 and we will continue the behind the scene work. If you are interested please come by!
