FUND-RAISING AUCTIONS

Dear SGAMS Members:

As you know, the pandemic has had its impact on our club – the General meetings are postponed, classes and workshop times are curtailed or currently suspended, and the decision was made that the future is too uncertain to hold the Annual Show in March 2021.

Meanwhile, our clubhouse still has its monthly utility expenses – just to maintain the building and the grounds- plus the annual expenses of taxes and insurance (see more on this under "Dues are Due" page 4).

Earlier in August we tried our first online auction using the website BetterWorld.org, which is specifically tailored to non-profits (i.e. low usage fees). Because of the perceived "gold mine" we have in the bin in the club yard of agatized coral, we started there; it was mildly successful, netting us \$152.

Here is where <u>you</u> come in! We need to have a wider range of items with a greater appeal to reach a bigger audience = more money! We are asking members to donate from your own collections, jewelry, faceted stones or cabochons that you have made, tools or equipment, - whatever you can – of *quality*, and general appeal.

We will be setting up a donation box at the clubhouse, and times when you can have access to drop your items off. We will set up a system with a form to complete, describing your item(s) and your contact information.

Once we have a reasonable amount of items, we will need some volunteers (note: limited to a few at a time to maintain a COVID safe environment) to prepare them for an auction. We will be photographing, logging and uploading the information onto the website. After the auction, items will need to be boxed and potentially shipped by USPS.

We will also need *everyone* to send the link for the auction to *everyone* they can!! Post it on your Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat or whatever social media site you can. The simple act of a few clicks and keystrokes on your part could be the lifeline to keep the clubhouse going!

So, go now, look through your collections, items you have made, and please choose something(s) that you feel will grab that buyer's eye! Create a bidding war! And keep the lights on!!

MINERAL OF THE MONTH:



Sapphire, Birthstone for September

Weighing in at 563.35 carats, the Star of India is one of the largest sapphires in the world, with a unique star shape that appears on both sides.

The name Sapphire derives from Greek "sappheiros" - blue. In antiquity, any blue stone such as <u>lazurite</u>, was called Sapphire.

At first only the blue variety was called Sapphire. Today corundums of gemstone quality of all colours except red are called Sapphire. The most desired colour is a pure cornflower-blue. Some blue and grayish-blue Sapphires (Sri Lanka, Thailand, Tanzania, Colombia, and others) exhibit a reddish or violet-red tint under artificial light - the alexandrite effect which is caused by admixtures of chromium and vanadium, the intensity is related to the concentration of these elements.

Inclusions of <u>rutile</u> needles cause a silky shine; aligned needles cause a six-rayed star sapphire.

Sapphires are commonly worn in jewelry. Because of remarkable hardness (9 in Mohs Scale), Sapphires are used in some non-ornamental applications (scientific instruments, high-durability windows, etc.)

Cab Shop reopening guidelines.

If there are openings, you will be put on the schedule.

We must ensure adequate social distancing so only three members at a time will be permitted to attend the Cab Shop session.
